

Say No to White Guilt!

Lifeline Expedition (LLE), a European organization, has come to Annapolis to “encourage reconciliation over slavery” — but *not* the slavery taking place today in Mauritania or the Sudan, or the trafficking in women and children that takes place in Benin, Gabon, and Israel. No, instead of dealing with these *real* problems, LLE is concerned with the American slavery *that ended 140 years ago*.

So how is Lifeline Expedition dealing with this non-problem? *By having Black volunteers tie up White volunteers and lead them through the streets of Annapolis*. This certainly won't change anything that happened 140 years ago, but it will make today's White people feel ashamed and humble. That's the real goal.

The Capitol, an Annapolis newspaper, took a non-scientific poll of its readers during the week ending July 16. This is what Annapolis residents thought of the Lifeline Expedition demonstration:

- Good idea 20.9%
- Interesting idea: 15.2%
- Bad idea: 62.8%
- Will e-mail opinions: 1.1%

Demonstrators in Annapolis are normally required to pay the costs of the police protection and other public expenses involved in their demonstration. But, disregarding *The Capitol's* poll results, the Annapolis City Council voted on July 26 to waive over \$2,000.00 in charges for the Lifeline Expedition demonstration. The City is forcing taxpayers to pay for demonstrations such as this whether we like it or not.

Lifeline Expedition has been shaming and humiliating White people since June 12, 2000, when they conducted their first demonstration in England. That demonstration was much the same as the one being held today: Whites tied themselves up and were led around by Blacks as penance for something the Whites didn't do and the Blacks didn't experience. Since then, they have brought their racist street-theater to France, Spain, Portugal — and now the United States.

Of course people are free to do what they like with their time. But the message of these demonstrations affects all of us: *Lifeline Expedition is saying that White people of today owe some kind of 'moral debt' to the Black people of today*. This wrong-headed notion is used in defense of riots and Black-on-White crime and in favor of “affirmative action” and monetary “reparations.” Lifeline Expedition's message is hateful and destructive to White people everywhere. Yet it is here on the streets of Annapolis, paid for with public money.
